| Briefly describe your project in an easy-to-understand way: | <p>SoundAsABell is an initiative geared towards educating young Nigerians about mental illnesses in a bid to alleviate the stigma and stereotypes associated with persons suffering from mental illnesses.</p> <p>It is saddening that persons with mental illness still have to struggle with double problems, first, with the symptoms of the diseases themselves, and then, the misunderstanding of the Nigerian society about the various mental disorders. As the high level of ignorance about mental illness and negative attitudes towards young individuals with mental disorders especially as related to depression and mood disorders continues to increase, the burden of depression also becomes heavier on the neck of the average Nigerian young adult. This depression, if untreated often leads to suicide and this has increased the number of premature mortality vis-à-vis mental illness in Nigeria.</p> <p>There is evident illiteracy on the subject as it relates to how the Nigerian society sees people with mental disorders and the negative stereotypes associated with them. These stereotypes are what the SoundAsABell initiative looks to eliminate by creating an avenue for mental illness literacy.</p> |

Question #1: What drives you in your work? In other words, why do you personally care about the issues you are working on? Please share a story if relevant.

As a Nigerian young adult who has been reminded countless times that I belong to a generation that will one day become the leaders of tomorrow, I find the number of bright minds our society has lost to depression and mood disorder-related illness saddening. Depression is a leading cause of disability amongst young Nigerians and has been projected to become the second most burdensome disease behind Malaria in the nearest future.

If the reports that depression has also been found to be the strongest single risk factor for attempted or completed suicides amongst young Nigerians is one to go by, the need to nip this in the bud is therefore more pressing than ever as suicide is the second leading cause of death in 15-29-year-olds and was the leading cause of injury mortality in the 2010s for all age groups combined. "Agony and confusion for the family as 22-year old commits suicide" is a headline that we have been far too familiar with within this part of the world.

Furthermore, stigma against people with mental disorders in general remains a significant barrier to positive outcomes in terms of recovery and rehabilitation of patients back to their families and the society at large as the widely shared prejudicial attitude towards disorders related to alcoholism and other substance use continues to stigmatize victims of these illnesses. This is so because the development of a mental health program depends largely on the role of each community's perceptions on the prevention and care of the mentally ill which is often influenced by the norms, beliefs, and customs within each community. While these perceptions tend to vary across traditions and cultures, their significance cannot be gainsaid as they tend to influence the pre-, intra-, or post-mental disorder treatment amon...

Question #2: Why do you want to be a Millennium Fellow? How will you use this distinction towards your future social impact work?

I would like to be a Millennium fellow because whilst giving me a chance to give back to the community, it also provides an opportunity for me to build the skills and gather the experience needed for me to increase how much I impact those around me and provide the support to work to advance the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. I am of the perspective that the world's most pressing problems require young leaders to be to bring the solutions and while I aim to be amongst the next generation of world leaders, I understand that Rome was not built in one day and that Charity begins at home. As such, I must impact those around me (i.e. my campus and immediate community) first. Given that the Millennium Campus Network is aimed at increasing the impact and solidifying the career path of future leaders, I believe the Millennium fellowship would help me network with leaders in the social impact sector. This distinction will be of use towards my future social impact work as I believe my experience as a millennium fellow will help develop the values I hold in high esteem, my professional skills, and help define a pathway to success in the social impact sector by preparing me to stand out even more and serve humanity even better.
